How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

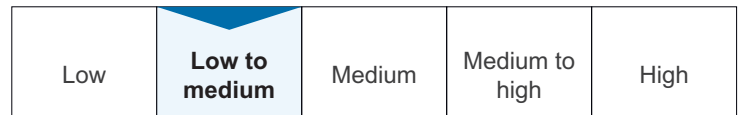
One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

1832 Asset Management L.P. has rated this Fund's risk to be **low to medium**.

This rating considers how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how the Series G1 units of the Fund have performed since it was created. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Who is this Fund for?

Investors who are ...

- seeking the income and capital growth potential of investments in equities that pay a dividend or distribution;
- able to accept some variability of returns and are investing for the long term.

Series G1 units are intended for investors resident in a province or territory of Canada in which the HST does not apply.

! Do not invest in this Fund if you cannot accept the volatility of equity markets.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series G1 units of the Fund. The fees and expenses, including any commissions, can vary among series of the Fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

New purchases of units of the Fund are subject to a front-end sales charge as described below.

New purchases under the Deferred Sales Charge option, Low Load option or Low Load 2 option are no longer permitted. If you currently hold units under any of these purchase options, you may make a permitted switch to the Fund under the same purchase option. In such circumstances, you will maintain the redemption fee schedule and rates outlined in the simplified prospectus offered in the year those other Fund units were originally purchased.

Front-end sales charge	0% to 5% of the amount you buy	\$0 to \$50 on every \$1,000 you buy	You pay this commission to your representative's firm at the time of purchase. This fee is negotiated with and paid to your representative's firm to a maximum of 5% and is deducted from the amount you buy. 1832 Asset Management L.P. does not receive any of this commission - it goes directly to your representative's firm.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the returns of the Series G1 units of the Fund.

The Series G1 units of the Fund's expenses are made up of management fees (including the trailing commission), fixed administration fees, trading costs and fund costs. The annual management fee is 1.25% and the fixed administration fee is 0.17% of the series' value. Because the Series G1 units of the Fund are new, the trading costs and fund costs are not yet available.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and/or advice your representative and their firm provides to you.

1832 Asset Management L.P. pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose:

Front-end sales charge: 0% to 0.60% of the value of your investment each year. This equals \$0 to \$6.00 each year for every \$1,000 invested.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, switch, redeem or reclassify units of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Switch fee	This fee is negotiated with and paid to your representative's firm to a maximum of 2% of the value of units you switch to another fund.
Short-term trading fee	If you redeem or switch securities within 30 calendar days of purchase or switch we may charge a short-term trading fee of 1% of the prior business day net asset value of the securities you redeem or switch.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy units of the Fund within two business days after you receive a copy of the Fund's simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
